Official assisted passage passenger lists

Series Description

These lists consist mainly of the official passenger lists of emigrants selected by the Colonization Commissioners, London, and whose passages were paid for out of the Emigration Fund.

The lists give passengers' names, and most give ages, occupation and marital status, while some give county of origin. Not all lists have survived. Passenger lists held in England relating to voyages prior to 1890 were "irregularly destroyed" in 1900 by order of the Board of Trade.

and a very valued friend who takes an interest in the Society is anxious to prevent the possibility of the Lads falling into the hands of bad people

I therefore request your kind intervention to see that the good-for-nothings at the Port dont get hold of them who recommend the Lads to any situations for which you may think they are suitable

The two Lads first mentioned would do for Town as well as for Country - the ~~two~~ last would be better on farms

Situations with respectable masters are desired by the Society rather than high wages to begin
