

IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION ACTS 1901-1905.

REGULATION No. 11.—DUTIES OF MASTERS

11. The Master or every vessel, other than a public vessel of any Government, arriving at any port in the Commonwealth, from parts beyond the Commonwealth, with any passengers on board for that port, shall, before making entry at the Customs, declare to the Customs Officer the names of such passengers, the names of the vessel, the name of the owner, the name, the nationality and race, the place of shipment, and the calling and occupation of each such passenger; and he shall, if required by the officer, certify in writing that each of such passengers is a person who is not suffering from any infectious disease (as therein stated) is an idiot or insane person, or a person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease of a loathsome or dangerous character, or a person likely by reason of any such disability to become a charge upon the public or upon any public or charitable institution.
