

IMMIGRATION RESTRICTION ACTS 1901-1905.

REGULATION No. 11.—DUTIES OF MASTERS

11. The Master of every vessel, other than a public vessel of any Government, arriving at any port in the Commonwealth, from parts beyond the Commonwealth, with any passengers on board for that port, before making entry at the Customs, shall deliver to an officer a list of all such passengers, specifying their names, surnames, the name, the nationality and race, the place of shipment, and the calling and occupation of each such passenger; and he shall, if required by the officer, certify in writing that to the best of his knowledge and belief none of the passengers in the list (except those stated to be an idiot or insane person, or a person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, or of a diseased, or of a disreputable, or of a dangerous character, or a person likely by reason of any physical disability to become a charge upon the public or upon any public or charitable institution.
