REPORT OF PASSENGERS for the Port of Melboune. from Parts beyond the Commonwealth.

Regulation 15.

DUTIES OF MASTERS AND MEDICAL OFFICERS OF VESSELS.

15. (1) The master of a vessel, other than a public vessel of a Government, arriving at any port in the Commonwealth, from parts beyond the Commonwealth, with any passengers on board for that port, shall, before making entry at the Customs, deliver to an officer a list of all the passengers for the port, specifying to the best of his knowledge, the name, nationality, race, place of shipment, and calling or occupation of each of those passengers.

(2) The master and the medical officer (if any) of the vessel shall make and sign a statement in writing on the list stating, to the best of their knowledge and belief, as to each of the passengers, whether he or she is insane or mentally defective, or is suffering from epilepsy, pulmonary tuberculosis, trachoma, or any loathsome or dangerous communicable disease, either general or local, or is suffering from any other disease or mental or physical defect likely to cause him or her to become a charge upon any public or aboritable institution.
