REGULATION No. 11.—DUTIES OF MASTERS.

REGULATION NO. 11.—DUTIES OF PUBLIC VESSELS.—(1) Every Government, arriving at any port in the Republic with a public vessel, or a vessel of the Republic, with any passengers on board for that port, shall, before making entry at the Customs, deliver to an officer a list of all such passengers, specifying, to the best of his knowledge, the name, the nationality and race, the place of shipment, and the calling and occupation of each such passenger; and he shall, if required by the officer, certify in writing that to the best of his knowledge and belief none of the passengers in the list (excepting the crew) is a diseased person, or a person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease of a loathsome or dangerous character, or a person likely by reason of any physical disability to become a charge upon the public or upon any public or charitable institution.
