DUTIES OF MASTERS AND MEDICAL OFFICERS OF VESSELS.

15. (1) The master of a vessel, other than a public vessel of a Government, arriving at any port in the Commonwealth, from parts beyond the Commonwealth, with any passengers on board for that port, shall, before making entry at the Customs, deliver to an officer a list of all the passengers for the port, specifying to the best of his knowledge, the name, nationality, race, place of shipment, and calling or occupation of

each of those passengers.
